Iguanas are large lizards that live in the tropical regions of Central America, South America and the Caribbean.




Iguanas are herbivores. That means they only eat plants.

Did you know that some iguanas could grow up to 5-6 ft? That's the size of most grown-ups!








Iguanas are part of the reptile family. Major characteristics of reptiles...

- 5. Breathe with lungs






