






The Sound of Porro



Que Llueva is performed in a music style called "El Porro". The origin of the "El Porro" is said to have begun with indigenous communities in the country known today as Colombia. The style was later enriched by African rhythms and European wind instruments.

COLOMBIA



INSTRUMENTS FROM EUROPE

Instruments may include the trumpet, euphonium, flute, clarinet, guitar, snare drum, bass drum, cymbals and more.

RHYTHMS FROM AFRICA

A rhythm is usually defined as a strong repeated sound pattern often demonstrated by playing drums or clapping.

Make A Rainstick





SUPPLIES


- Cardboard tube
- Nails
- Hammer
- Clear packing tape
- Rice and/or beans
- Duct tape, wrapping paper, paint, markers, etc. (for decoration).

STEPS

- 1. Tape off the bottom with clear packing tape.
- 2. Place first nail toward the end of the tube hammer it in.
- 3. Rotate tube and place nails around all the way down to the stick.
- 4. Pour rice and/or beans through into your tube.
- 5. Tape off open end.
- 6. Decorate your rain stick.
















